



Merit-based Scholarship Policy for International Students (JCFS)

Admissions Scholarship

JCFS offers financial aid in the form of admissions scholarships. Scholarships are granted on a case-by-case basis depending on the applicant's English level, academic standing, extracurricular activities, and admissions interview. Admissions scholarships are given for tuition only and typically range from 30% ~ 70% of the tuition cost with the condition of maintaining a 3.60 GPA during the initial semester of admissions entrance. In extraordinary circumstances, a financial tuition grant of 100% may be granted.

Continuing Student Merit-based Scholarship

In subsequent semesters after the initial admissions semester, students are eligible for Continuing Student Merit-based Scholarship. The minimum GPA standard (Cumulative Grade Point Average [CGPA] or Combined Grade Point Average [CBGPA]) is required for both new and continuing students to automatically retain their Admissions or Continuing Merit Scholarship from the previous assessment period (semester). The minimum requirement of at least 3.60 for CGPA or CBGPA.

Students who are unable to maintain their Admissions or Merit-based Scholarship from the previous semester and those students who are seeking to increase their awarded amount with higher CGPA or CBGPA may be eligible for Merit-based scholarship. These students should refer to the table below for the requirements necessary for the following semester.

Selection Criteria	Tuition Scholarship
4.50	100%
4.25-4.49	70%
4.00-4.24	60%
3.75-3.99	40%
3.60-3.74	30%

#1: Students must be enrolled in the previous semester.

#2: Minimum of 15-credit load of courses (excluding Winter/Summer semester) with no "F" in any courses.

#3: Not eligible if all the courses are of P/F type.

#4: GPA = 15-week. CGPA = Cumulative GPA. Based on the higher of the two.

*All scholarships are tuition-based. There is no financial aid available for cost of living expenses like dormitory, meal plans, books, medical insurance, student activity fees, and other living expenses. These other costs are not covered by Admissions or Merit-based scholarships and these expenses are borne by applicants.
